

Project Types and EU-Financing Rates

Small-scale projects

- Budget max 20 000 Euro/country
- Lump sum support

Regular Projects

- Budget up to 200 000 Euro (Staff + 40%)
- Budget over 200 000 Euro (Staff + 40% OR all cost categories)

Financing Rate

- 65% EU-funding for Swedish and Finnish partners
- 50% IR-funding for Norwegian partners






Finnish national co-funding – What has changed?

Interreg

 Regional Council of Lapland makes the co-funding decisions and administers the payment applications


Application submission only after the EU funding decision (within 4 months of the official decision)

- One application on behalf of all Finnish project partners
- National co-funding can be up to 70% of the non-EU portion of the budget
- Min 4 900€ and max 200 000€ per project
- Regional Council of Lapland will conduct financial controls. No costs for the projects!





Example: Budget for Finnish partner 200 000 €





Three take-aways:



- 1. Apply for national co-financing only after you receive the decision from Interreg Aurora.
- 2. One Finnish partner submits the co-financing application on behalf of others.
- 3. No need to reserve funding for the "FLC" costs in the budget!

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
